The Fall 2025 Family Support Summit spotlights three timely priorities drawn from NFSN member and training feedback:


Father Engagement • Parent Leadership • Program Sustainability

Opening Plenary Session

Beyond Engagement: Building Authentic Relationships with Fathers

Presenter: Robert Harris

This keynote will spotlight the transformative role of fathers in strengthening families and communities. National leader Rob Harris, a longtime advocate and practitioner with extensive experience advancing fatherhood initiatives nationwide, will share research, personal stories, and strategies that move the field beyond "father engagement" toward building authentic, sustaining relationships with fathers. The session will highlight the current state of father involvement across the country, the ways language shapes this work, and how fathers' voices, leadership, and lived experiences drive stronger family and community outcomes. Participants will also explore the policies, practices, and relational strategies that best sustain fatherhood programs and support fathers' well-being over the long term.

At its core, it reframes ROI, not just as Return on Investment, but as a strategy to achieve Resilience, Opportunity, and Impact.

The conversation will spotlight practices that build trust, foster shared power, and sustain thriving Parent Advisory Committees. Together, panelists will lift up the "secret sauce" of authentic outreach and engagement.

- Elayna Fernandez (The Positive Mom), an award-winning storyteller and advocate, brings her expertise in elevating parent voice and empowering families to lead change.
- Arthur Argomaniz (Center for the Study of Social Policy), a national trainer and advocate, will share his experience supporting fathers and families through programs that center culture and belonging.
- Jolyana Begay-Kroupa (Phoenix Indian Center) will highlight how the Parenting in Two Worlds program supports Native and LatinX families in urban communities through culturally responsive parenting education.
- Kukunaokalā Yoshimoto (Blueprint for Change, Hawai'i 'Ohana Support Network) brings a
 perspective on how culturally grounded, Native Hawaiian practices and the Neighborhood Places
 model elevate parent voice and leadership across communities.
- Monica Beltran (Escuela Verde), Parent Leader and Educator, will moderate the session and share a parent perspective.

Together, they will lift up how parents define leadership in their own contexts, highlight outreach strategies that have proven most successful, and discuss how programs can address systemic barriers while honoring culture and language. Participants will see how these approaches strengthen both families and long-term sustainability.


